- Help welcome Brazilian applicants on campus in Cambridge and Boston.

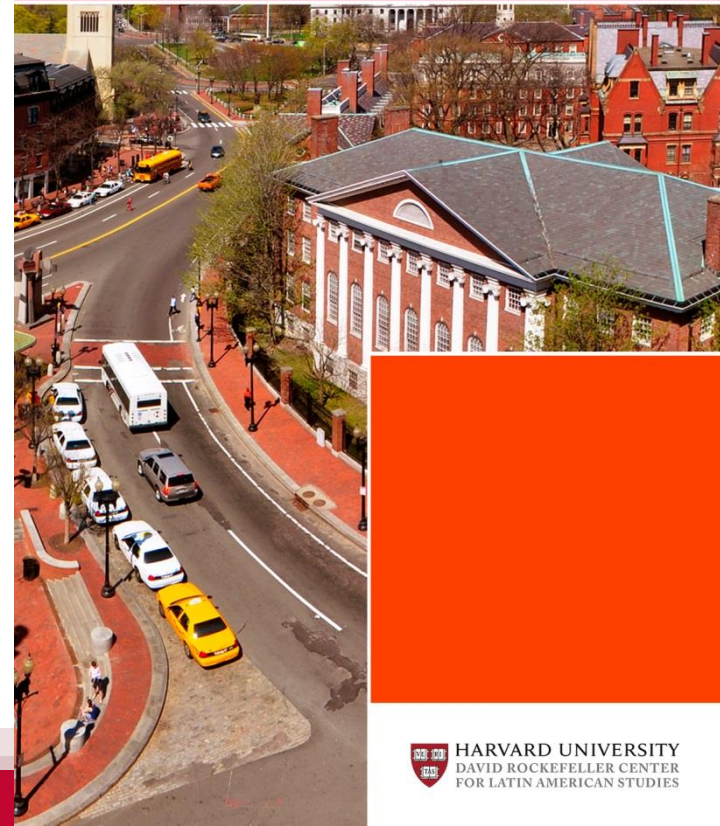
